PROFESSIONAL TRAINING FOR CHRISTIAN MINISTRY

Payne Theological Seminary's academic program leading to the Master of Divinity degree is designed to prepare men and women for competent and faithful service to the Church and to the community in a way that meets the needs of a rapidly changing world.

The Master of Divinity degree is an 82-credithour program that can be completed in three to five years of full-time or part-time online study. In addition to the core curriculum, students are guided through a one-year supervised experiential learning experience in a church setting and a non-church setting.

The Master of Divinity degree provides professional training for Christian ministry and further graduate studies. While most Payne students go into the pastoral ministry, the seminary trains persons for work as chaplains, educators, pastoral counselors, community development practitioners, and scholars.

Core curriculum areas of study include:

- 1. Biblical Studies
- 2. Historical Studies
- 3. Theology, Religion and Ethics
- 4. Practical Ministry

MASTER OF ARTS IN RELIGIOUS LEADERSHIP

PROFESSIONAL TRAINING FOR PERSONS NOT SEEKING ORDAINED MINISTRY

The Master of Arts in Religious Leadership (MARL) is designed to prepare men and women not seeking the ordained ministry. The MARL degree is a 48 credit-hour program that can be completed in two years of full-time **online study**.

The MARL degree provides those persons in nonordained ministry roles to engage in theological training to fill positions of leadership in the African Methodist Episcopal Church and other faith-based opportunities.

DOCTOR OF MINISTRY

ADVANCED PROFESSIONAL TRAINING FOR MINISTRY

The Doctor of Ministry (DMin) degree program is a three-year program is designed for persons with a minimum of three years' experience in fulltime ministry, completed their Master of Divinity degree, and wish to further their education.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

The DMin program is implemented over six consecutive semesters. Each semester begins with a one-week DMin intensive followed by Peer Focus Group seminar sessions. The six phases and corresponding semesters are:

- 1. Advanced Preparation for Ministry
- 2. Problem Analysis in the Practice of Ministry
- 3. Foundations for the Practice of Ministry
- 4. Research Methods for Ministry
- 5. Field Research, Data Collection/Data Analysis
- 6. Research Writing and Final Preparations

DMin FOCUS GROUP RESEARCH

The DMin program uses the techniques of Focus Group Research whereby a small group of participants (normally 6 - 12) are led by a moderator to explore the probable success of a particular commodity.
